<p>The School Advisory Council (SAC) prioritized fostering a love of reading and enriching arts education this year. Funds were allocated to purchase new books for the school library, ensuring students have access to engaging, diverse, and high-quality reading materials. The SAC also supported a series of art workshops led by local artists, including French-speaking artists who worked with our Primary to Grade 2 students. These experiences provided authentic cultural connections, enhanced students' creativity, and enriched learning opportunities across the school.</p>
